Financial Stability

We have made some difficult financial improvements in the recent past. However, we have much more challenges ahead to achieve the high goals we have set for P@SHA Secretariat to serve industry interest in all areas.

P@SHA has covered a journey from PKR 10 million organization to **PKR 61 million organization** in one-year (April 2021 – March 2022). Our projected revenue for next year (April 2022 – March 2023) is over PKR 120 million.

Hiring & Organization Structure

- P@SHA Secretariat has been expanded to a team of 13 members by hiring 8 new resources.
- Redefined focus by prioritizing organizational structure, memberships, members' engagement, learning & development and marketing.
- Streamlined organizational processes and bringing clarity in the role of P@SHA.
- Hiring budget allocated for all future hiring.



Policy Advocacy and Government Affairs

P@SHA Chairman & Secretary General had multiple meetings with different government departments during this year.



Ministry of IT & Telecom (MoITT)

Cash Reward Scheme

- The Cash Reward Scheme is a financial incentive introduced by the MOITT to accelerate growth of IT & IT-enabled Services (ITeS) export remittances by incentivizing Year-on-Year growth in export remittance receipts.
- Companies with positive export remittances in FY2020-21but zero export remittances in FY2019-20 will also be rewarded at a financial incentive rate of 3%.
- P@SHA led a rigorous advocacy campaign to raise awareness on the application process amongst the members and facilitate the queries regarding procedural challenges. P@SHA quickly escalated and resolved the issues faced by the companies.
- Assisted MoITT in roundtable meetings to develop a Pakistan's first-ever Digital Pakistan policy shaped by industry needs.

MakeinPakistan

- Concept paper for MakeinPakistan submitted.
- Lawyer needs to be engaged for the detailed analysis of PPRA rules and a stronger case for government's support in promoting local innovation in Pakistan

Financial disbursement/ loan scheme for IT & ITeS companies

P@SHA Chairman and SG proposed MOITT to introduce a collateral-free IT equipment loan for IT & ITeS
companies and increase the amount allocated to the industry for a Long-term financing disbursement scheme.

Import Restrictions Impact on the ICT equipment and services in Pakistan

Chairman P@SHA wrote a letter to the Federal Minister, MoITT on behalf of the industry to raise the issue of recent import restrictions placed on the ICT equipment and components which are quintessential to the operations of companies. The letter noted the impact such restrictions would have on the business operations for instance losing critical credit lines built over decades of relationship, jobs, and financial impact on the country.



- P@SHA CEC Member, Barkan Saeed, and SG provided inputs to the PM Office about ease-of-doing business challenges in Pakistan.
- P@SHA Chairman Badar Khushnood and SG had a meeting to discuss bottlenecks and challenges of the IT industry.

Tax Exemption



exemption certificates processed with P@SHA's support



- P@SHA has presented a strong data-driven case to escalate industry issues. Surveys were rolled-out among members on a monthly basis to monitor trend of the exemption certificates
- 3 sessions conducted with FBR Regional Offices in Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad
- Close coordination of Secretary General with Commissioners from Karachi and Lahore: more than 100 companies got exemption certificates since P@SHA's meetings with FBR officers

FBR vs. PRA: Duplication of tax

P@SHA escalated the issue of FBR demanding companies to pay sales tax despite being paid to PRA (lack of
understanding of software to be classified as a service vs. goods) – a recommendation from P@SHA has been
sent by asking that any further measures should not be taken against companies who have paid tax to at least
one authority, while the joint-clarification be issued

POS License

- P@SHA conducted a meeting with FBR officials to discuss feedback on POS license
- A working group was created of all POS providers among P@SHA members: 40+ companies across Pakistan, which provided feedback
- Detailed feedback was shared with FBR, which resulted in a positive response from FBR on relaxing capital limit requirement for POS providers
- P@SHA provided recommendations for compliance of POS provider integration with FBR
- A follow-up meeting was conducted in December emphasizing on the need of bringing clarity for the POS Providers
- Sindh Revenue Board
 - At the seminar organized by the information science and technology department of Government of Sindh in collaboration with PSEB and P@SHA announced reduction of the Sindh IT Sales tax from 13% to 3%.

Issue Resolution on Taxation challenges

 P@SHA SG, Chairman, and CEC member Salman Dar wrote a letter to Chairman FBR mentioning the taxation issues consistently faced by the IT &ITeS industry. A suggestion for nominating exclusive commissioners for IT companies was made.



Pakistan Software Export Board (PSEB)

- Coordination on Internship Portal launched for the IT industry with 3,500 internships. The initiative allows companies
 to apply to get interns who'll be paid by PSEB
- Coordinated with PSEB on Growth Enterprise Market (GEM) Board, allowing IT companies to apply for investment and listing.
- Coordination on software technology parks being developed by PSEB in different cities, and attending STP launch in Skardu, Quetta and Rawalpindi
- Close coordination on major planned initiatives for Skills and Branding
- Advocated Pakistan's first-ever financial incentive for IT companies PKR 5 billion cash reward
- More than PKR 2 Billion allocated to PSEB for IT industry marketing & development

PSEB Membership renewals

P@SHA secretariat facilitated the renewal applications of the companies. More than 20 cases of P@SHA members were escalated and resolved.

Tariff Concessions Proposal

The Ministry of IT and Telecom and PSEB requested P@SHA to submit a proposal on Custom Tariff concession to be forwarded to the Tariff Rationalization Board. The proposal was based on informed insights and data compiled by P@SHA through industry feedback.



Ministry of Commerce (MOC)

 P@SHA Chairman and Chair eCommerce Committee presented the industry's case in multiple meetings with SAPM (Special Advisor to PM for e-Commerce). Badar Khushnood has been the leading member of the National E-Commerce Council.



Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA)

 P@SHA Secretary General worked with PSEB to issue a letter by PDMA to allow IT companies in Lahore to continue operating during lockdown due to smog



Ministry of Finance (MOF)

 Shared Federal Budget Proposal recommendations with the Ministry of Finance and provided industry recommendation to government departments on an ongoing basis



Ministry of Interior (MOI)

• P@SHA Chairman Badar Khushnood worked with the Ministry of Interior to facilitate visas for the TikTok team. Due to P@SHA's efforts to facilitate the management team's arrival, TikTok had a productive visit and it was unbanned from Pakistan.



Special Technology Zones Authority (STZA)

STZ Committee

- P@SHA had 04 meetings with the STZA team on policy/progress and shared feedback on IT industry needs
- P@SHA raised the issue of including an ex-officio representative of P@SHA in STZA's Board of Directors
- A draft version of P@SHA's Position Paper is being developed
- Survey rolled out to obtain inputs from members on STZA regulations
- Questions are being compiled to be sent to STZA for feedback



Board of Investment (BOI)

- P@SHA CEC members Khuram Rahat and Ali Ihsan had a meeting with BOI to discuss the role of P@SHA in bringing MNCs to Pakistan
- P@SHA Chairman attended BOI B2B Investment Conference
- P@SHA Chairman Badar Khushnood had a meeting with Chairman BOI to conduct a joint-event to discuss all
 factors and steps to attract investments in Pakistan. The event was conducted on January 7 and had more than
 400 attendees.

Inclusion of P@SHA in the Visa Invitation Letter Issuance and Verification

P@SHA was included in the E-Bill online Visa Registration. SG P@SHA wrote a letter to the Director General, DGTO, Ministry of Commerce, to include P@SHA in the E-Business Invitation Letter System. NADRA has already offered to help train the team at P@SHA on the development and implementation of the system once P@SHA has been included in the visa invitation letter system.



State Bank of Pakistan (SBP)

Fintech Committee

- A workshop conducted with the State Bank of Pakistan to discuss IT industry's feedback and latest policy changes.
 P@SHA consolidated feedback from all members and presented in front of the State Bank
- A follow-up meeting was conducted in December to discuss overall feedback and improvement. A financing product specifically meant for IT companies is being developed by the State Bank of Pakistan. Chair Fintech Committee Ammara Masood is leading the conversations from P@SHA's side.
- Advocated SAAF Scheme for SMEs to get finance from banks without collateral
- Facilitated a finance product specially developed for IT companies by SBP



- P@SHA SG and CEC Members Salman Dar and Khuram Rahat had a meeting with the senior officials of World Bank to discuss payment issues
- Collaborated with ADB, World Bank, GIZ, and others to address bottlenecks in increasing IT & ITeS exports



Asian Development Bank

 P@SHA Chairman, SG and CEC Members participated in a focus group with Asian Development Bank to provide inputs on bottlenecks in increasing exports for IT and ITeS industry in Pakistan



Punjab Information Technology Board

- CEC Member Ali Ihsan participated in a consultative session on industry-led boot camps. Chairman P@SHA had a meeting with Chairman PITB on collaboration areas.
- Chairman P@SHA Upon the advice of Provincial IT Minister, Dr. Arsalan Khalid, Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB) and Pakistan Software Houses Association (P@SHA) signed a MOU to promote e-Rozgaar initiatives through industry participation and facilitating job creation through expanding the horizons of online employment opportunities in Punjab. The aforementioned MoU is aimed at promoting market-oriented skills development of IT students to enhance their employability – both nationally & internationally.



GB IT Board

 P@SHA secretariat has initiated engagement with the GB IT board for policy planning & regulation and skill development related to the IT industry in GB.



Sindh Revenue Board

• Under the finance Act 2022-2023, the Sindh government introduced a dual tax regime for the software/IT based consultants i,e. they could choose either 13% sales tax with input adjustment or 3% sales tax without input adjustment. P@SHA organized a masterclass titled "Sindh Revenue Board (SRB) - Tax Compliance Awareness Session" for member awareness.



Policy Roundtables

Economic Potential of Gaming Industry in Pakistan, Powered by Tencent

• P@SHA hosted a session on "Economic Potential of Gaming Industry in Pakistan" in collaboration with Tencent. The session focused on the potential of the gaming industry and the regulatory frameworks and policy support measures required by the Animations, Graphics and Gaming subsector. It was attended by stakeholders from government, industry, academia and entrepreneurs.



Policy Member Engagement

Putting forward an informed opinion and data-based proposals is the ultimate aim of the policy advocacy at P@SHA. Therefore, P@SHA secretariat has been actively involved in compiling feedback from members and escalating their challenges to the relevant government.

Ministry of Planning Development & Special Initiatives

- Higher Education Commission (HEC) has held a roundtable with the Federal Minister Planning & Development,
 Ahsan Iqbal on HEC reforms and industry-academia linkages. The roundtable was attended by SG, P@SHA, with
 CEC member Dr Shoab.
- Secretary General P@SHA met with Ahsan Iqbal on IT industry challenges and recommendations. The Federal Minister promised full support of the government to drive the IT sector on an accelerated path for export growth The Finance Minister Planning and Development, Ahsan Iqbal, convened a meeting with the Chairman and SG to discuss the challenges being confronted by the IT sector and to devise a roadmap for enhancing IT sector exports. The meeting was also attended by SRB, FBR, and MoITT.

P@SHA at Turnaround Pakistan Conference

• The Turnaround Pakistan Conference was organized by the Ministry of Planning and Development as an exercise to set Vision 2025. The conference drew upon extensive consultations with a very wide range of stakeholders. Under the pillar of private sector-led growth, a working group titled "IT & Digital Economy" was organized. The senior representatives from P@SHA shared a presentation on the current challenges faced by the IT & ITeS and recommendations for inclusive and sustainable growth of the industry.



Budget Campaign: IT Industry Abandoned in the Budget 2022-202

- As a representative and voice of the IT industry in Pakistan, P@SHA has been actively involved in policy advocacy—recommending policies and suggesting implementation processes—with the government bodies. In the light of the draft budget 2022-2023 announced, P@SHA led a robust budget campaign.
- P@SHA issued a press release signaling strong disapproval of the budget 2022-2023 announced recently. Despite ambitious remarks made by the Prime Minister of Pakistan to target USD 15 billion IT and IT-enabled services exports, the announced budget **not only abandons but decimates the industry's** ability to deliver on this target. The full press release can be read here.
- Budget Recommendation 2022 is a public document of budget recommendations released for the first time. The document aimed to not only suggest fiscal policies to the government but also to raise awareness in the industry and member companies. Within the P@SHA community, the public budget recommendations document seeks to bring transparency, record data, and consolidate feedback. The recommendation document can be accessed here
- Comparative Analysis: Support Policies in Emerging IT Economies was launched in June to study the support policies practised by the countries in the Indo-Pacific region and suggest recommendations for Pakistan to build a mature tech ecosystem. The report is an extensive study of the tech ecosystem in the regional countries. Policies such as "indirect tax waivers", "research and development", and "improved access to finance" cover a major part of the report. By drawing comparison to the regional players, the report helps articulate positioning of Pakistan's IT sector globally and suggests policies, adopting which Pakistan can become an attractive tech destination. The full report can be read here.
- Our narrative dissemination reached 645,882 individuals within 2 months via digital channels alone in addition to receiving coverage in major nationwide & industry-relevant news media.





 - 58% of participants consider 'Verbal abuse & malicious gossip' as workplace harassment.





Background

In December 2021, the Pakistan Software Export Board (PSEB) launched an RFP titled 'IT Industry Readiness Bootcamp' with the intention of preparing unemployed and underemployed youth for industry integration by means of 300-hour long, intensive courses. P@SHA had been advocating the need for an intervention of this nature for quite some time. The technology tracks covered by the bootcamps included in the RFP were informed by the 'P@SHA Skills Requirement Survey 2021', a survey conducted by P@SHA to provide data on the industry's training needs and requirements.

As an industry representative body, P@SHA took the lead in forming a consortium with P@SHA member companies to deliver these bootcamps. For the formation of the consortium, P@SHA launched an EOI titled 'Industry Trainer' to encourage and invite member companies to participate in the program and build the requisite talent pool that would help fulfill the talent demand of the industry. 71 applications were received to be part of the consortium, out of which 22 companies were shortlisted based on the RFP eligibility criteria to sign formal agreements that led to the formation of a Joint Venture and Consortium.

P@SHA also took the responsibility of working on the technical and financial aspects of the proposal that was submitted in response to the RFP launched by PSEB. The 93-page technical proposal consisting of 350+ mandatory and supporting documents was prepared and submitted by P@SHA on behalf of the Joint Venture, and in February 2022, the project was successfully awarded to the Joint Venture.

Program Kickoff

In April 2022, the joint venture led by Contour Software with P@SHA as strategic partner signed a contract with PSEB for IT Industry Readiness bootcamps to upskill **4,000 graduate**s in seven of the most top-in-demand technologies and prepare them for immediate industry integration.

These 16 companies along with 6 additional consortium partners have been working tirelessly with P@SHA over the past few months to prepare for the launch of the **TechLift Bootcamps** that are to take place in various locations of Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad in October and November.

The objective of this program is to fill the gap between the industry requirements and the supply of skilled resources who are coming from academia. The program and its potential to upscale has a long-term benefit for the IT industry. P@SHA's strategic role in curriculum development, trainer development, M&E framework, placement model and dispute resolution forms pillars for industry's long term benefits.

P01 - Policy:

To develop and validate a working model/framework for training of IT resources at a national level to bridge the gap between supply and demand.

PO2 - Job Creation:

To make the unemployed/underemployed IT/Engineering graduates ready for integration into the industry.



The following activities have been carried out to make these bootcamps a successful and scalable initiative.

Preparation for the Bootcamps and Subsequent activities Launch of Landing Page and Registrations Portal:

In preparation of the first ever industry led bootcamps, Techlift has launched its landing page with complete information related to the program's eligibility, tracks and geographical coverage to help the candidates. The induction process started with the registration and online entrance test portal going live. So far, the program has received over 11,000 registrations that are expected to increase with the increased marketing efforts by the end of September 2022. Training of Trainers:

To achieve the most effective learning outcomes that the industry urgently requires, Techlift prepared its industry-nominated trainers through a first round of Training of Trainers conducted by School of Leadership in Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad. These sessions focus on making the trainers understand the intended outcome of the program, its focus, design and need, and prepare them to effectively deliver the curriculum. So far, TechLift and School of Leadership have trained **101 industry trainers** through 3-day, interactive, in-person sessions.

Another round of training will be completed by the end of September that will see the remaining **100 industry trainers** who will lead the bootcamps in similar 3 day in person sessions, bringing the total number of trained resources to **more than 200.**

Industry-led Curriculum Design and Development:

For the first-of-its-kind industry-led curriculum development for 07 technology tracks, industry experts from the joint venture and consortium have partnered with seven of the technology education sector's top education institutes to prepare and adapt industry material into cohesive, effective courseware for the bootcamps.

In addition to technical skills, all boot camps have been structured to include a 30-hour soft skills component that will groom students in professional ethics and workplace conduct. 30 percent of the course content has been finalized to commence the bootcamps, while the remaining is being developed to be delivered to trainers on a rolling basis. The curriculum will be uploaded onto an LMS by the end of September and the main cohorts that begin in October will utilize the LMS to conduct their classes.

To ensure that the strategic objectives of the program were met, P@SHA's Learning and Development team worked to create a robust instructional framework based on the Association of Computing Machinery's latest curricula recommendations. Once the framework was set, a curriculum development exercise with industry working groups was completed, and experts from the 22 member companies met in over 50 online and offline sessions to ensure curriculum-industry alignment.

Pilot Cohorts:

To test the waters, Techlift initiated a small number of bootcamps through an advanced cohort phase with **500+ learners**. This stage was meant to provide early insights to a model that is being implemented in the industry for the first time, and ensure that challenges can be proactively addressed for the regular cohorts. 05 of these bootcamps have been completed by Frag Games (02) and Cure MD (03) with a total of **158 graduated learners**. Cure MD who has led 3 of these bootcamps for 76 learners **employed 68** of the graduates immediately after the completion of their training.

P@SHA is creating a phased approach of placing the graduating learners in suitable job roles in the industry. The model is based on an evolving and improving framework that will profile candidates and connect them to relevant vacancies, eventually leading to a **robust placement process** that can be used to connect talent with companies beyond just the TechLift program.

In addition to the early results, advanced bootcamps are a source of program improvement and a way of creating interest in the program from prospective students for future cohorts.

Main cohorts

The main bootcamp cohorts that start from October 2022 will train **3,500 learners** by the end of January 2023. These graduates will be skilled by the industry and placed in their respective fields as per the demand in the industry. All of the graduated candidates will be linked with the industry to meet the demand and a placement model will be utilized to fill the industry's demand gap.

Professional Skill Development Program (PSDP)

This program has been designed to close the skilled resource gap. This program had successfully completed its PSDP-I, which started by vetting the applications by training partners and out of 21, 10 were selected to run the initial cycle. PSDP-I has conducted 60 training sessions with substantial subsidies to P@SHA member companies. Recently, with 9 new training partners this program has expanded into PSDP-II.

CXO Mentorship (January 2021 - December 2021)

This mentorship program was initiated for connecting young/new CXOs with senior industry leaders for both mentorship and networking. It has matched 13 CXO mentors with 14 CXO mentees. Each mentee was required to spend a minimum of 8 hours in a calendar year with their mentor. Both mentors and mentees provided periodic feedback to P@SHA secretariat. The mentorship program kicked off with 13 mentor/mentee pairs, but only 9 pairs were able to continue the program till Quarter 3 & 4. The detailed testimonials were collected and shared with the members' community. CXOs mentor and mentees who have completed the program completion requirement of completing 8 hours have been awarded their completion certificates by P@SHA as well.

The second cohort of P@SHA CXO Mentorship will be launched soon!

Academia-Bridge Program

This program was launched in September 2021, for bridging the academic industry gap by forming a collaboration between a software company (Industry Partner) and a university (Academia Partner) to provide hands-on training to students by replacing their course labs with a newer technology stack and bringing in senior engineers and technologists from the industry to conduct these labs. The pilot has already been in action with a collaboration between Contour Software and Sir Syed University of Engineering and Technology, where the team from contour has updated the lab content and is teaching MERN/MEAN stack in the Web Engineering course labs.

P@SHA Skilled HR Development Roundtable

At the P@SHA ICT Awards 2020-21 in Karachi on October 23rd, 2021, P@SHA had conducted roundtable discussions on five important themes: Skilled HR development, Fintech, Ease of doing business, Diversity & Inclusion and E-Commerce. These policy roundtable discussions aimed to discuss the challenges faced by the IT industry players and look for their viable solutions. P@SHA Skills & Development (S&D) Committee launched a policy whitepaper resulting from the Skilled HR development roundtable discussion.

At the ITCN Asia 2022 in Lahore on March 16, 2022, P@SHA conducted roundtable discussions on skilled HR development. The round table included attendees from both the industry and academia, as well as officials from PSEB. The key takeaways from the discussion were

- Create employment for trained graduates
- Capacity building of the IT industry



Progress Highlights

- I was not involved by the Chairman or the Secretariat in any policy related interactions with any government body so this section is NOT APPLICABLE.
- However, I was involved in interaction with teams from the World Bank and the Asian Development Bank when requested by the Secretariat and contributed accordingly.
- I was involved by PITB, Planning Division and HEC in my personal capacity and contributed actively. I have also been involved in the IT Bootcamp Trainings program also.

Committee Chair Update

The governance committee is tasked with the role of advising CEC and secretariat on policy and governance related issues brought to its notice and monitoring progress on any key policy and compliance issues.

Following are some of the key activities that were brought to Governance Committee;

- It was brought to the attention of the governance committee that there were discrepancies in the Articles of Association published on the website and those submitted to DGTO. After extensive search of internal records, the governance committee was informed that there was no documentation available to support changes in most of the cases. The committee after deliberation directed the Secretariat to create a comparison sheet. After extensive evaluation and discussion it was decided to categorize the changes and in cases where approval was needed from the General body, the same will be presented during the AGM for approval.
- P@SHA license renewal had been pending for a couple of years. The Governance committee followed up with the Secretariat for getting the renewal on priority basis and due to excellent efforts of the Secretary General, we have managed renewal of P@SHA.
- Pending tax matters were brought to the attention of the governance committee. The governance committee kept getting regular updates from the Secretariat on progress in light of advice from tax consultants.
- P@SHA's skill committee was contemplating taking the lead role in the Industry based joint venture. The governance committee advised that P@SHA could not be an active member of the Industry JV due to its mandate as a representative body. However, it could act in an advisory role to the Industry led JV. This advice was validated by the legal consultants also and P@SHA has moved accordingly.
- The governance committee helped the Secretariat in investing P@SHA funds in a secure investment with best possible returns. It also helped getting initial investment costs waived off.
- The governance committee also advised P@SHA secretariat to get rectified from the CEC the expenses incurred on hirings to support the Industry Training Bootcamp, since the costs incurred may not be recoverable as the JV companies are not obligated to pay P@SHA. Since this advisory activity entails cost outlay therefore it will be good to get this approved by CEC for future reference.
- Secretariat informed about plans of moving Secretariat from a Co-working place to its own office. The Governance committee, while supporting the move, advised the Secretariat to prepare a comparative statement and long term cost projections and get the same approved by CEC.
- The Governance committee also asked the Secretariat to ensure that the different processes like; selection of Judges, election committee members etc. are properly documented and approved by CEC.
- The progress on financial affairs of P@SHA were not shared with the governance committee.
